Schuylkill Intermediate Unit 29 (IU29) convened a Pandemic Committee comprised of Administrators, School Nurse, and Professional Staff. IU29 Administration and the School Nurse work with Schuylkill County Emergency Management Services, the Superintendents of the 12 Member Districts, the PA Department of Health, and the PAIU Network to monitor the most up-to-date CDC and PA Department of Education Guidance. Health and Safety Plans are updated and revisions are submitted for board approval as changes are required. IU29 is committed to providing in-person instruction to the greatest extent possible. IU29 will be utilizing a combination of disinfecting and monitoring for the 2022/2023 School Year. All Staff, Students, Parents and Teachers are notified of changes via website at www.iu29.org, email, and All Call System.

| C. | Handwashing and respiratory etiquette; | Handwashing will be continuously monitored and prompted before and after meals, use of restrooms and when necessary to promote better health. |
| d. | Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation; | The continued use of the air purifying systems and the handheld sanitizers will be maintained. Teachers will be asked to continue the best practice of wiping down high touch areas throughout the day. Early Intervention will continue the practice of using clean and dirty bins for toys to maintain continued sanitation and reducing multiple students using the toys between cleaning. |
| e. | Contact tracing in combination with isolation and guarantine, in collaboration with the State and local health departments; | The school nurse will maintain tracking and assuring the use of isolation and quarantine areas as needed. Communication with administration and parents of continued practice of not returning until free of symptoms following CDC guidelines will continue. All staff will be notified of the importance of not coming to work if having any symptoms. |
| f. | <u>Diagnostic</u> and screening testing; | IU29 encourages parents and staff to self-monitor diagnostic screening. Signage is posted at the main entrance of the IU29 building to remind visitors to self-monitor. The school nurse will assess any students identified as showing symptoms and recommend testing, if needed. |
| g. | Efforts to provide <u>vaccinations to school</u> <u>communities;</u> | IU29 hosted a vaccination clinic in March 2021 to vaccinate school professionals. Information regarding vaccination clinics is sent to families of our students. |
| h. | Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies; and | Staff continue to encourage regular handwashing and help the maintenance staff with disinfecting the classrooms. |
| i. | Coordination with state and local health officials. | The Executive Director will maintain communication with state and local health officials regarding positive cases and changing COVID-19 Guidance. |
