Risk Factors and Warning Signs:

May include but not limited to the following:

RISK FACTORS	Warning Signs
 RISK FACTORS Behavioral Health Issues/Disorders: Depression. Substance abuse or dependence. Previous suicide attempts. Self injury. Personal Characteristics: Hopelessness/Low self-esteem. Loneliness/Social alienation/isolation/lack of belonging. Poor problem-solving or coping skills. Impulsivity/Risk-taking/recklessness. 	 Expressions such as hopelessness, rage, anger, seeking revenge, feeling trapped, anxiety, agitation, no reason to live or sense of purpose. Recklessness or risky behavior. Increased alcohol or drug use. Withdrawal from friends, family, or society.
 Adverse/Stressful Life Circumstances: Interpersonal difficulties or losses. Disciplinary or legal problems. Bullying (victim or perpetrator). School or work issues. Physical, sexual or psychological abuse.	Dramatic mood changes.

Warning signs and factors can occur in isolation or in combination.
