The Schuylkill Learning Academy is committed to meeting the comprehensive needs of the student through a variety of educational and behavioral health services. Services are offered to students in K-12 grades.

Services Include:

- Alternate Education
- Behavioral Intervention
- Day Treatment
- Intensive Alternative Education

DAY TREATMENT SERVICES

We provide individual, family, and group counseling in addition to behavioral support. All students in this program will be enrolled in the Schuylkill County Children & Youth Program. The Schuylkill Learning Academy's success is built upon a cooperative working relationship with the family as we strive together to improve the overall health and well being of our students.

SCHUYLKILL INTENSIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM

Schuylkill Intensive Education Program (SIEP) utilizes educational services specifically designed to meet the school district's needs while implementing an approach that helps students make substantial gains educationally, emotionally, and socially.

We work with school districts, courts, and child welfare agencies to meet their needs.

The SIEP model focuses on secondary students who are:

- Expelled or suspended from school
- Experiencing behavioral or emotional difficulties and/or mental health concerns
- In conflict with teachers or persistently violating school protocols and rules
- Returning to the community from residential treatment or placement

ALTERNATE EDUCATION

The student's academic needs are met through a variety of educational options such as regular education, itinerant emotional support or full time emotional support. Education at the elementary level is individualized based on the student's grade and instructional level. Secondary students will receive their education via a Blended Schools Program with the support of regular education teachers and an itinerant teacher for those students with an Individualized Education Plan (IEP). Secondary students can also be educated in a full -time emotional support classroom through their IEP. This process allows teachers to individualize instruction for all students at their current grade level, needs, and specific course assignment.

Counseling:

The Schuylkill Learning Academy provides two levels of counseling support from the least to most intensive.

Behavioral Intervention:

Behavioral Management support in the classroom and daily group activities.
