



# 2018 SUMMER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OFFERINGS

**COMPREHENSION STRATEGIES FOR HS AND MIDDLE SCHOOL TEACHERS** JUNE 12 AM

Learn to enhance comprehension of content area reading through active engagement with text. This session is recommended for MS or HS teachers in any subject area.

**CLOSE READING WORKSHOP: TURNING COMPREHENSION INTO ACTION** JUNE 12 PM

Learn to deepen comprehension and turn it into close analytic reading. This session is recommended for ELA teachers from 3rd grade through 12th grade.

**GOOGLE DRIVE** JUNE 13 AM

Google Drive allows you to access all of your files as well as collaborate with others by allowing users to share and edit documents, spreadsheets, and presentations in real-time.

**FORMATIVE ASSESSMENT TECH TOOLS** JUNE 14 AM

Formative assessment is one of the most effective instructional strategies. This workshop will highlight technology tools that will help you find out what your students know and allow you to modify instruction in an effective and engaging way.

**GIFTED GALORE** JUNE 18 AM

In this session, you will receive an overview of gifted screening and evaluation protocols as well as review components of a GIEP. Time will be allotted at the end to discuss any concerns relating to gifted education at home districts.

**INTRODUCTION TO DISCIPLINARY LITERACY** JUNE 18 PM

Learn what disciplinary literacy is and how to turn your subject area into active engagement in a discipline. This session is recommended for Middle School or High School teachers in any subject area.

**WELCOME TO THE WORLD OF CODING (K-5)** JUNE 20 PM

This workshop is geared for K-5 educators. Participants will explore code.org and understand how it can be implemented in the K-5 classroom. Participants will also experience other coding apps/programs to enhance computer science education in our youngest students.

**DIFFERENTIATION FOR DUMMIES** JUNE 19 PM

This newly updated differentiated instruction training provides an opportunity for K-12 educators to enhance Tier 1 Core Instruction through high-quality, research-based differentiated instruction and formative assessment techniques.

**3-ACT MATH (MATH TASKS)** JUNE 20 AM

Developed by Dan Meyer, 3-act tasks are engaging problem-based lessons that allow students to decide what is worth solving which increases curiosity and promotes deep inquiry. These lessons can be adapted from K through algebra.

**DIFFERENTIATING FOR ENGLISH LEARNERS BY CONTENT TEACHERS** JUNE 21 AM

Understanding the structure and elements of PA English Language Development Standards Framework and resources and strategies to support implementation in content areas. Learn about the English Learner (EL) Differentiation Protocol and tool currently available.

**WRITING ACROSS THE CURRICULUM** JUNE 21 PM

Learn to incorporate writing into every lesson and deepen understanding at the same time. This session is recommended for any teacher from 3rd grade through 12th grade.

**(NEW) Ensuring Academic Success for English Learners – Part 1** JUNE 4 DAY

Do you know how to ensure success for ELs in your classroom? This session will give you a foundation by reviewing ESSA and English Learners, basic WIDA terminology and materials, key points from the Basic Education Circular (22 Pa. Code §4.26). Three instructional strategies to use to differentiate instruction in your classroom will be shared along with how to use the PA English Language Development Standards with Content Teachers (transforming MPIs). Free for Title III members districts.

**USING PRIMARY SOURCES IN YOUR CLASSROOM** JUNE 11 AM

Primary sources are not just for history class. In this workshop, teachers learn about the vast amount of primary sources available at their fingertips through the Internet. Teachers learn how to navigate and search each website to locate letters, maps, sound clips and more. In addition, discover some creative ways to integrate and use these items to help engage students in learning.

**CAREER READINESS – PA CAREER ZONE FOR TEACHERS / PHEAA RESOURCES** JUNE 12 DAY

Career connections for students are every teacher's responsibility. In this five hour session we will explore the free resource, PA Career Zone, recommended by the PA Department of Education. Teachers can use this resource with students for career & college research, portfolio building, budgeting, and much, much more in their classrooms. In the afternoon Linda Pacewicz from PHEAA will share resources to help schools complete their Career Readiness tasks.

**WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT..... OER!** JUNE 25 AM

Open Educational Resources (OER) sounds simple.... Right? There is a lot more than you realize. In this workshop, participants learn about OER, the 5Rs, the #GoOpen movement, copyright and much more. See how these resources can be implemented into your classroom.

**GOOGLE'S BEST KEPT SECRETS**

JUNE 26 AM

Google has a ton of resources that can be integrated into your classroom. In this workshop, participants will discover some of the hidden tricks, techniques, and programs that Google has to offer. Some of these include Google Keep, Action item assignment in Google Docs, and Google Books just to name a few.

**(NEW) STEM Educator in the Workplace** JUNE 26, 27, 28 DAY

For teachers, administrators and counselors, this 2 ½ day workshop will consist of four industry partner tours from the local community. On the tour participants will learn of STEM connections between the industry and the classroom. The purpose of STEM Educator in the Workplace is to provide high-level professional development and support for teachers, counselors and administrators, to enhance a workforce/career development perspective and to heighten academic relevance. Participants will receive 14 Act 48 Credit Hours provided they complete the required assignments for the course by the due date.

**TOOLS & TIPS TO HELP WITH FAKE NEWS** JUNE 27 AM

Can you tell the difference between fake and real news? In this workshop, participants will learn about fake news and why it exists. Included in this workshop are tools and resources to help evaluate the information you find online.

**DIVING INTO DISCOVERY** JUNE 28 DAY

Discovery Education Streaming is one of the largest video libraries available with over 10,000 videos covering K-12 core curriculum areas. In this all day workshop, participants will get an overview of everything this program has to offer including board builders, teacher tools, content collections, strategies and free resources.

**TEACHING WITH "COMMON SENSE"** AUGUST 8 AM

Common Sense Media is a free K-12 educational resource that provides tools and lesson plans to teach digital literacy and citizenship. In this workshop, participants will have the opportunity to learn about and explore the curriculum and tools that are available for them to use for their students.

**MAKERSPACE 101** AUGUST 9 AM

What is a Makerspace? In this workshop, participants will learn what a makerspace is, receive tools and resources on how to get started, and look at some of the tools that can be used as part of the creative space.

**DIGITAL CITIZENSHIP** AUGUST 13 DAY

This all day workshop will provide tools and resources needed to help teach colleagues and students the skills that they need to become better citizens online. This workshop will cover such topics as netiquette, copyright, Internet safety and your digital footprint.
